

Today we welcome to Mission Concepcion as our Pastor Fr. Michael Bouzigard, S.J., a native of New Orleans, Louisiana. He was raised in a family of 7 children. He worked with the poor in Mexico, the Philippines, El Salvador, Belize, and Nicaragua.

At Loyola University New Orleans, Father Bouzigard worked in campus ministry and as research fellow for the Jesuit Social Research Institute (JSRI). He later served as assistant professor in the Center for Latin American and Caribbean Studies. Father Bouzigard has also lectured at the University of Central America (UCA) in Managua, Nicaragua, as a visiting professor of theology and professor of applied local economic development. In 2010, he

received missions to the provincial office of the Jesuits as international assistant and associate province treasurer while also serving as parochial vicar at Holy Name of Jesus parish in New Orleans.

From 2013-2019, Fr. Bouzigard variously ministered as local Jesuit superior, pastor [Our Lady of Guadalupe parish], dean [West Urban Deanery], and spiritual director [Assumption Seminary] in San Antonio. Father Michael currently resides at Assumption Seminary continuing as spiritual director and serving in a new mission as director of the Office of Clergy Ongoing Formation in the Department of Clergy and Consecrated Life at the Pastoral Center of the Archdiocese of San Antonio.

Fr. Michael enjoys cycling along the River Reach, fishing, watching (mostly foreign) films, and relaxing with good books. He enjoys sharing fine wine, conversation, and food with friends. We are certainly blessed to have Fr. Bouzigard as our priest and spiritual leader. Please join with me in welcoming him to Mission Concepcion.

# NEW QUARTER PAYS TRIBUTE TO MISSIONS

The United States Mint (Mint) today officially launched the America the Beautiful Quarters® Program coin honoring San Antonio Missions National Historical Park in Texas. This is the fourth quarter of 2019, and the 49th coin overall in the program.

The reverse (tails) design of the quarter depicts elements of the Spanish Colonial Real coin to pay tribute to the missions. Within the quadrants are symbols of the missions: wheat symbolizes farming; the arches and bell symbolize community; a lion represents Spanish

cultural heritage; and a symbol of the San Antonio River represents irrigation methods and life-sustaining resources.

The America the Beautiful Quarters® Program is a 12-year initiative that honors 56 national parks and other national sites authorized by Public Law 110-456. Each year until 2020, the public will see five new national sites depicted on the reverses (tails sides) of the America the Beautiful Quarters coins, with a final coin scheduled for release in 2021. The Mint is issuing these quarters in the order in which the national sites were officially established.
