Dear Brothers and Sisters. In last Sunday's "Faith" section of our newspaper, Fr Ron Rolheiser wrote about three competing popular notions that make for a religious person. For some it is religious practice (church going, keeping the commandments). For others it's the practice of justice (responding to widows, orphans and strangers). And for still others, it's compassion (having a wise and altruistic heart). He then reminds us that Jesus endorses all three, referencing the Sermon on the Mount where Jesus tells us simply: "Be compassionate as your heavenly Father is compassionate." Keeping the commandments and working for justice are to be done with a wise, compassionate heart. The three together constitute proper religion, though "compassion is the prism through which the other two must be seen and enacted." Jesus invites us to be compassionate because "he causes his sun to to rise on the bad as well as the good, and sends down rain to fall on the upright and the wicked alike" (Matt 5:45). In the wake of the recent shootings and violence in our country, we must ask ourselves, if we're Christians, can we love and forgive a person who has done a horrible act? Can we let our sun shine on everyone without discrimination? Can we be compassionate as God is compassionate?
